This landfill is owned and operated by the City of Corner Brook and provides waste disposal facilities for the City of Corner Brook and communities in the Bay of Islands area. Beverage containers

Scotia Recycling Ltd. operates a Green Depot in the City at 55 Maple Valley Road for beverage container recycling.

Cardboard/newspaper

There is a ban at the Wild Cove Landfill on industrial, institutional and commercial recyclable corrugated cardboard. However, all residents are encouraged to recycling cardboard by bringing it to Scotia Recycling.

Leaves/ Christmas trees

Leaf recycling and Christmas tree recycling programs are available in the fall and winter months. Details are announced at those times.

Metals

The City has a metals storage area at the Wild Cove Landfill and metals are sent for recycling annually. Metals can be dropped off at no charge during business hours at the landfill site.

Tires

Household Hazardous Waste

The City of Corner Brook in conjunction with the Multi- Materials Stewardship Board and the Provincial and Federal Governments provide household hazardous waste collection events twice a year. The primary objective of the HHW Program is to provide residents of the City of Corner Brook with a safe method to dispose of unwanted special wastes such as paint, oil, propane tanks, pesticides that cannot be disposed of with regular garbage.
