CITY OF CORNER BROOK RECREATIONAL VEHICLES REGULATION

<u>Pursuant</u> to the provision of section 10 Motorized Snow Vehicles and All-Terrain Vehicles Act, R.S.N.L 1990 c. M-20 and sections 201 and 202 of the City of Corner Brook Act, R.S.N.L. 1990 c. 15 and all other powers it enabling the Corner Brook City Council in a session convened on the 21st day of April, 2008, hereby passes and enacts the following regulations:

Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the City of Corner Brook Recreational Vehicles Regulations.

Definitions

- 2. In these Regulations
 - "Approved Area" means any area or areas in the City approved by Council for use and operation of recreational vehicles for development of trails for use and operation of recreational vehicles;
 - "City" means the area defined in Schedule A of these Regulations;
 - "Council" means Corner Brook City Council; and
 - "Recreational Vehicle" means all wheeled or tracked motorized vehicles designed or adapted for off-road use.

Prohibited Operations

3. No person shall use or permit to be used, a Recreational Vehicle in the City, either on or off a highway within the City.

Applications

4. Notwithstanding Section 3 of these regulations, Council may on Application of any person, association, organization or corporate entity permit development of trails for the use of recreational vehicles in an Approved Area.

Approval of Applications

5. In considering an Application for the establishment of trails for use of Recreational Vehicles in an Approved Area, Council shall take into account such policies and conditions as set out in its applicable laws and regulations and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the policies and conditions set out in Schedule B of this regulation.

Fee

6. Council may prescribe a fee for processing the Applications, either by separate resolution or as a part of the Council's annual budget.

Penalty

7. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these regulations is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00 or in default of payment, to a period of imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or to both fine and imprisonment.

Exemption

8. These regulations do not apply to recreational vehicles owned and operated by the Council and those persons who are exempt by the provisions of the Motorized Snow Vehicles and All-Terrain Vehicles Regulations 1163196.

Severability

9. If a court of competent jurisdiction should declare any section or part of a section of these regulations to be invalid, such section or part of a section shall not be construed as having persuaded or influenced Council to pass the remainder of the Regulations and it is hereby declared that the remainder of the Regulations shall be valid and shall remain in force.

Coming into Force and Repeal

10. These regulations shall come into force as of the date enacted by Council and the City of Corner Brook Recreational Vehicles Regulations are hereby repealed upon the coming into force of these Regulations.
