- Corner Brook is one of the first municipalities in Atlantic Canada to incorporate Integrated Community Sustainable Planning (ICSP) measures into a municipal planning policy and regulatory framework to result in an Integrated Municipal Sustainability Plan (IMSP)
- Municipal Partners in Climate Change Action Planning
- Active in Flood Risk Mapping-Climate Change
- Municipal Partner for Climate Protection (PCP)-Completed Phases 1 and 2
- Certified Silver LEED building and Green design of our City Hall Complex-we were the first in our province.
- Invested in a heat recovery system that extracts heat from the ice, stores it; and then pumps it back into the building when needed at the Civic Centre
- Installed a Heat Recovery system at the Curling Risk to Reduce energy usage
- Partnered with the Corner Brook Museum and Archives to convert part of City Hall Complex from oil heat to an Ecodan Air Source Heat Pump
- We are using the District Energy Feasibility Study key document to work towards redeveloping the downtown
- The first municipality in the province to offer curbside recycling pickup of paper and cardboard
- Hybrid vehicles as a part of our Municipal Fleet
- Elaborate network of walking trails which we are expanding
- Bike Lane - Share The Road Program
- Smaller Public Transportation Buses
- Curbside Fall Leaf Collection
- Honeywell Energy Audit and Energy Reduction Plan completed for the Civic Centre
- LED Energy-Efficient traffic Lights which reduce energy use
