Issue: This is a balancing change order to cover final quantities as constructed. The primary source of change was additional asphalt, which was increased from the contract quantity to reduce the number of surface joints and repair areas of distress. A detailed breakdown of the balanced quantities is attached.

Background: Upgrades were required to improve safety and bring the traffic systems up to current national standards. This project is a Phase 1 of an overall traffic signal improvement program and has been underway since early spring of this year. Due to the extensiveness of the traffic control system upgrades at one of Corner Brook's intersections at West Street and Main Street, extra quantities were required to complete the project.

Recommendation: Approve the contract Change Order No. 4 between the Owner (City of Corner Brook) and Contractor (West Coast Excavating and Equipment Co. Ltd.) for the Traffic Signal Improvements at Main Street and West Street for an increase in Contract for \$25,981.82 (HST Included).

Be it resolved that the Council of the City of Corner Brook approve the contract Change Order No. 4 between the Owner (City of Corner Brook) and Contractor (West Coast Excavating and Equipment Co. Ltd.) for the Traffic Signal Improvements at Main Street and West Street for an increase in Contract for \$25,981.82 (HST Included).

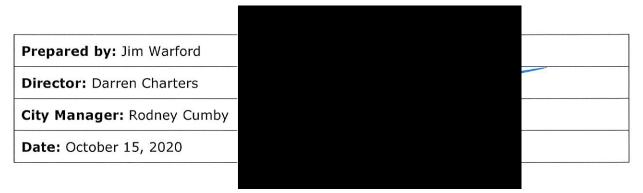

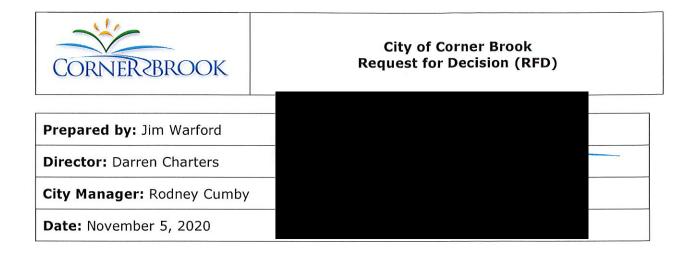

- b) Sampling and data gathering to fill in data gaps
- c) Discussion with operators to understand bottlenecks or site-specific characteristics
- d) Calculate the current capacity of each unit operation of the existing mill WWTP

- c) Consider ownership models and related impacts on operations and/or cost contributions (capital vs operating)
- 5. Investigate and develop three technical options for combining the two WWTPs, with the following preliminary options:
 - a) Separate WWTPs with separate or combined effluent
 - b) Mill WWTP with mill effluent polishing at City WWTP
 - c) Fully combined WWTP
- 6. Develop preliminary design schematics and cost estimate of preferred option
- 7. Prepare report on the above items
- 8. Present report to CBPPL and the City

We appreciate that Kruger have an existing consultant relationship with Mr. Alain Durocher who provides technical analysis and engineering support at other facilities. We propose to work with Mr. Durocher as a partner or peer-reviewer in the analysis. The exact scope delineation between CBCL and Mr. Durocher would be clarified upon initiation of the assignment.

As an additional task to the above items we can also complete process software modelling of various co-treatment options. At this scale of blending, co-treatment of municipal and pulp waste is not common. The modelling can be used to fill technical gaps in performance knowledge that will come from the assessment. BioWin is the most common industry software tool for this type of assessment. If desired, particularly if there is a promising option following the above tasks, we can also carry out the following modelling.

- 9. BioWIN model confirmation:
 - a) Literature review to identify appropriate rate constants and model inputs for combined treatment elements
 - b) Sampling program to characterize wastewater
 - c) Prepare BioWIN model of preferred mill-based option and run model to confirm treatment performance

SCHEDULE

We anticipate delivering this study (Tasks 1–8) within 6 months of approval to proceed, with confirmatory modelling following this if desired.

AGREEMENT OF PURCHASE AND SALE

<u>BETWEEN</u>	<u>CITY OF CORNER BROOK</u> , a body corporate duly continued pursuant to the <i>City of Corner Brook Act</i> , RSNL 1990, c. C-15, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Seller")
AND	<u>RESIDENT</u> , a resident of the City of Corner Brook, Province of Newfoundland and Labrador (hereinafter called "the Buyers")

<u>WHEREAS</u> the Seller owns property located adjacent to 36 Water Street in the City of Corner Brook, Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, more particularly described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto (hereinafter referred to as "The Property");

AND WHEREAS the Sellers desire to sell The Property and the Buyers wishes to purchase the property;

NOW THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION of the sum of \$1.00 and other valuable consideration (the receipt and sufficiency of is hereby acknowledged by both parties hereto) now paid by each party to the other, the parties hereby agree as follows:

PROPERTY AND PURCHASE PRICE

1. The Seller hereby agree to sell and the Buyers agrees to purchase the Property located adjacent to 36 Water Street in the City of Corner Brook, Province Newfoundland & Labrador, more particularly described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto (hereinafter referred to as "The Property") at a purchase price of Ten Thousand One Hundred and Eighty Two Dollars (\$10,182.00) plus taxes in accordance with paragraph 6(a) and paragraph 6(b) regarding HST (hereinafter referred to as "the Purchase Price").

DEPOSIT

2. The Buyers submits with this offer the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) payable to the Seller as a deposit to be held in trust, pending completion or other termination of this agreement and to be credited towards the purchase price on completion. The balance of the Purchase Price to be paid on closing.

CLOSING

3. This agreement shall be completed on or before the September 18th, 2020 (hereinafter called the "closing" or "closing date").

TITLE SEARCH

4. The Seller are to furnish the Buyers with a sketch of The Property which is the subject of this agreement within 5 days of signing this agreement, after receipt whereof the Buyers is allowed 30 days to investigate the title to The Property, which the Buyers shall do at its own expense. If within that time any valid objection to title is made in writing, to the Sellers, which the Sellers are unable or unwilling to remove, and which the Buyers will not waive, this agreement shall be null and void and the deposit herein shall be returned to the Buyers, without interest and without liability by the Buyers for any expenses incurred or damages sustained by the Sellers.

CONVEYANCE

5. The conveyance of The Property which is the subject of this agreement shall be by warranty deed, drawn

- b) The Buyers acknowledges and agrees that the Seller make no representations or warranties of any kind express or implied that the present use or the future intended use by The Buyers are or will be lawful or permitted or as to the suitability of The Property for development.

SURVIVE CLOSING

12.

- a) The termination of this Agreement shall not affect the liability of either party to this Agreement to the other with respect to any obligation under this indenture which has accrued but not been properly satisfied or discharged. The Buyers acknowledge and agree that the provisions in this agreement for indemnifying and saving harmless the Sellers from liability shall survive the Closing or other termination of this agreement.
- b) All warranties, representations, indemnities, and "save harmless" provisions contained in this agreement shall survive closing unless otherwise stated in this agreement.

OVERDUE PAYMENTS

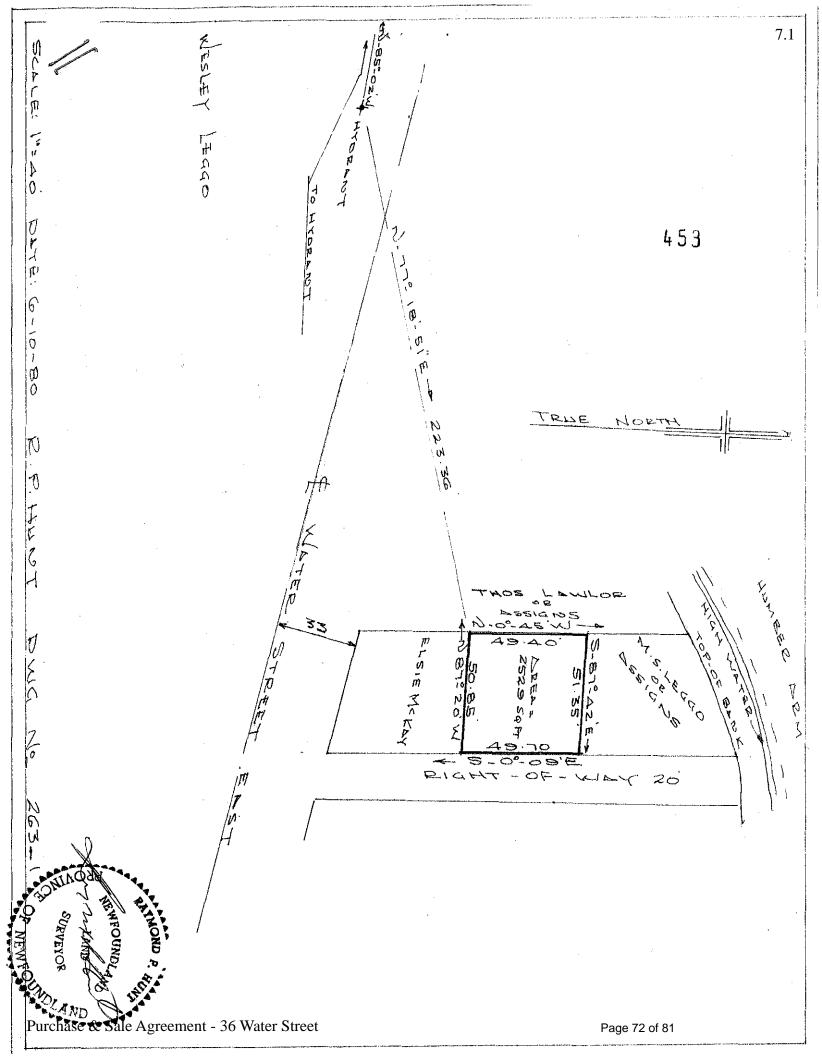

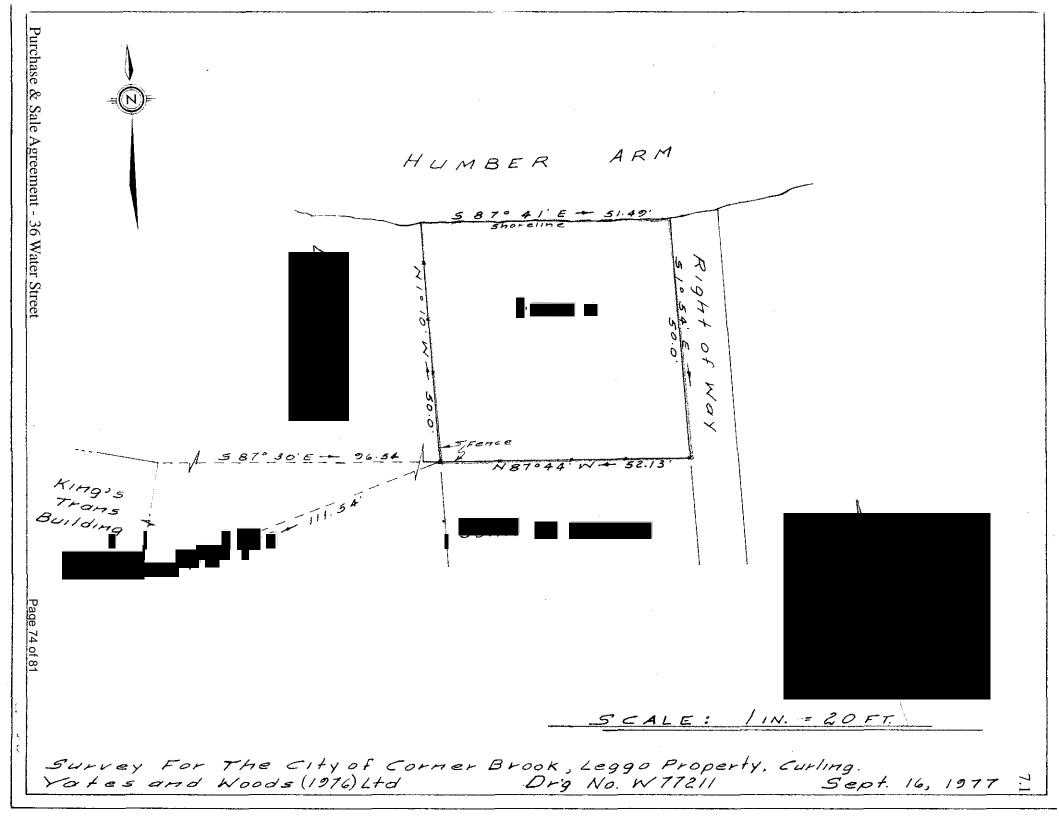

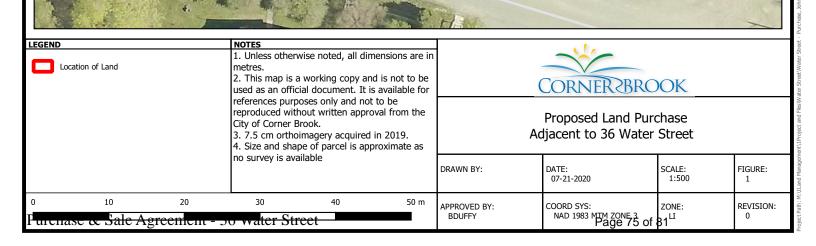
